We are currently facing another general lockdown, due to the Covid19 pandemic, but we, still by the grace of God, continue to serve the needy at the soup kitchen in Tel Aviv.

We thank and praise our good Father in Heaven for his constant provision for the ministry entrusted to us.

In addition to that, we want to let you know that we have received a huge donation that includes: socks, tights and clothes for women as well as many garments for men and children for the cold season; besides we were given a lot of sleeping bags, men socks, sport shoes and wool hats that we distributed to all the needy and homeless people who are coming to the soup kitchen.

These are very important items as many people sleep in the streets and need to keep themselves from cold in the winter season.

The distribution of food and clothing, as you all know opens the door for us to share with those who come to us, the good news of the gospel of our beloved Lord and savior Yeshua Ha Mashiach (Jesus Christ).

In last December we celebrated Hannukah by distributing typical Jewish "sufganiots" (sort of filled donuts) which people cannot afford themselves and therefore received and enjoyed very happily.

Also some Ethiopian children, usually playing at the playground across the street, came to get some of the delicious donuts and to drink some juice. They were joyful and are now coming more often also to get some sandwiches or soup from us, and of course to listen that Yeshua is the Messiah of Israel, Halleluyah!

The biblical account tells us that Yeshua touched, healed, delivered, had compassion, exhort and fed the crowds, just because he loved them:

"...having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end." (John 13:1)

We pray that God would humble and soften our hearts giving us the right heart to continue to do His will whatever it may happens in our ways.

Yeshua also said: "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:16)

We believe and pray that the works we are doing and our conduct toward them will cause them to see the light of God within us and to fall before him in full repentance.
