Shalom dear brothers and sisters from the land of Israel!
Let us praise God for He is merciful unto us and keeps his covenant forever!
By grace, we entered into that wonderful covenant based upon the blood of Yeshua (Jesus).

As every month, here it is the account of what we have been through lately.

A brother took care of his wound and shared the gospel with him in the meantime! Alex was very glad, and full of gratitude afterwards! Hallelujah!

A group of young brothers and sisters, whom are on a discipleship program, have been visiting us to reach the needy in our area.

They are willing to grow in the faith and in the service to our Lord and are committing their lives to that purpose.

Every now and then they prepare the sandwiches and head out to Tel Aviv to distribute and to reach the needy in the streets nearby.

Please, bless and support them through your prayers that they may bear fruit unto the glory of God.

God's constant provision never fails, HE always make sure that we can serve the people in the best possible way. We are always amazed and thankful for the ways HE provides beyond our expectations.

"He has remembered his mercy and his truth toward the house of Israel: all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God." (Psalm 98:3)

Here, the word "mercy" is better translated into "faithfulness". In Hebrew, instead, it is "beemunato", which literally means "His faith": that implies that God will remember His grace to the people of Israel and bring them to the right faith in Yeshua Ha Mashiach. Yeshua also is the grace and the true faith of God for all the ends of the earth.

God promised in his word that He would save the people of Israel, and He truly keeps his promises!

After many years of preaching in the streets of the Land of Israel, we are encouraged and happy to tell you that we have been recently witnessing more openness to the gospel of our Messiah.

In other words, willingness, both to hear the gospel and to confess the faith in Yeshua in prayer, which we believe it is not something small: Muslims and religious Jews alike are opening their hearts to the gospel, as the following story testifies.

Chaim, a religious man, popped into our place, once again (he has come several other times) so that we had the chance to share with him the Gospel.

We prayed for salvation over him, as you will see in the pictures. He gladly received Jesus into his heart in prayer and kept mentioning and blessing his name constantly, which is very important for such a religious man!

Chaim, means in Hebrew "life" and it is a dual word, meaning that there are physical and spiritual life alike.

Chaim is physically alive, thank God! Still, he was missing something ...

Please pray that he will be born unto true spiritual life that only is in Yeshua (Jesus).

A Muslim guy, on the other hand, heard about the faith of God: the death of Messiah Yeshua, as a sacrifice and atonement for the remission of sins for all flesh and his glorious resurrection from the dead on the third day to grant us eternal life. Afterwards, he thanked God very much for hearing the good news of the blessed gospel and took an Arabic booklet on his own initiative.

Praise be to our Lord! For He saves (Jews and gentiles alike), He anoints, He causes the seed of the Gospel to grow, He expands His Kingdom, He prepares the works for us to practice them. Let us be humble and submissive to him like sheep to their shepherd!

"...and when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that does not fade away." (1Peter 5.4)

For all that you have read, to God alone be the glory through Yeshua Ha Mashiach (Jesus), forever.
